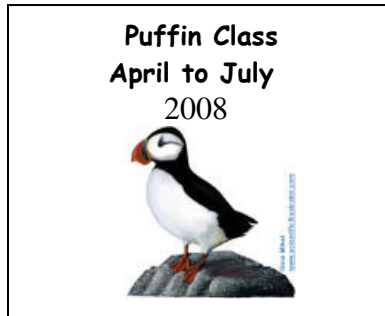


In our lessons this term we will:



Science – Plants and mini-beasts

Learn about how plants grow feed and reproduce. Find out about the effect of light, air, water and temperature on plant growth. Understand the importance of leaves and roots. Learn about the variety of groups and animals and the groups to which they belong. Find out about different plants and animals and the habitats to which they belong and how they are suited to the environment they are found in. Understand what a food chain is.

English

Re-tell the main parts of a story. Recognise parts of a text eg the opening, build-up, atmosphere. Compare some real life adventures with fictional stories. Discuss characters' feelings and behaviour eg are they fair or brave? Compare types of humour eg word play, joke poems, word games, nonsense verse etc. Read aloud and recite poetry that plays with language. Compare stories by the same author. Write openings to stories or chapters. Write a story in the first person. Write book reviews and poetry. Write letters, notes and messages linked to work in other subjects. Organise letters into simple paragraphs.

Maths

Compare two three-digit numbers. Round any three digit number to the nearest 100. Add several small numbers. Add or subtract a near multiple of 10 to a two-digit number. Solve money or 'real-life' word problems. Use informal pencil and paper methods to support addition. Measure and compare using litres and millilitres. Read scales. Solve measurement word problems. Recognise and sketch lines of symmetry. Read and begin to write the vocabulary of position, direction and movement. Recognise that a straight line is two right angles. Begin to find remainders after division. Compare two familiar fractions. Use informal methods to support TU-TU and HTU-TU. Use a calendar. Interpret data in Venn and Carroll diagrams.

R.E.

Writings - Children will find out about different writings and how they are presented in different religions.

Geography - Village Settlers (linked to Vikings)

Learn how settlements develop over time and how early settlers provided many of the settlements we use today.

Design and Technology

Design and make a storybook.

P.E.

Learn how to play different roles in striking and fielding games eg rounders, cricket. Develop an understanding of athletic activities. Learn how to set targets and improve performance in a range of running, jumping and throwing activities. To create sequences of movement in gym and dance and suggest ways that work can be improved. Improve swimming strokes and become more confident in the water.

Music

Listen and respond to music from around the world.

Learn some invader songs.

History - Vikings

Children will learn about the Vikings focusing on who they were, where they came from, how they lived and what they left behind.

Viking art - Children will be experimenting with materials to create art work in the style of Viking artists. They will be creating rubbings, prints and clay work.
